If you plan a vacation from June to late August, please begin now to look for priests to cover your Masses.

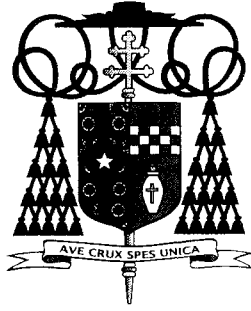

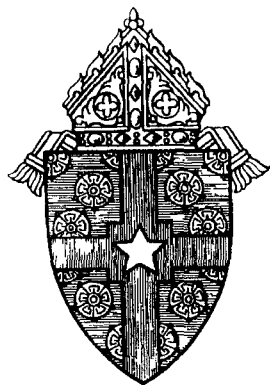

# **PRESBYTERAL COUNCIL**

*Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston*

Minutes  
Meeting of April 20, 2010

The Council met in the Board Room of the Nold Education Building at St. Mary's Seminary. Cardinal Daniel DiNardo presided. Fr. Sean Horrigan called the meeting to order at 10 a.m. Fr. Eric Pitre offered the Opening Prayer for His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI on the 5<sup>th</sup> anniversary of his election to the papacy. Fr. John Huber, CSB, took the roll.

MINUTES: The minutes of February 16, 2010 were accepted as presented. Fr. Patout moved the acceptance of the minutes and Fr. Joe Gietl seconded it. They were accepted by a voice vote. Fr. Horrigan congratulated Msgr. Sheltz on his appointment as Chancellor.

COUNCIL SECRETARY AND MEMBERSHIP CHANGES: Fr. Horrigan congratulated Fr. Huber on his new appointment as principal of Detroit Catholic Central High School in Novi, MI and thanked him for his participation on the Council. In the meeting of February 16, Fr. Huber had been elected secretary and Fr. Paul Felix was the runner-up. Fr. Felix was again nominated and unanimously elected as the new secretary of the Council. As Fr. Huber represents the Educational Apostolate on the Council, the runner up for that post had been Fr. Daniel Lahart, S.J. Per the statutes of the Council, Fr. Lahart will replace Fr. Huber and finish out the remainder of his term.

ARCHDIOCESAN FINANCIAL REPORT: Mr. David Hessel, Chief Financial Officer for the Archdiocese, joined the group to give an update to the Council on certain financial matters for the Archdiocese. He covered the following:

There has been an uptick in the Archdiocesan investment portfolio so that by February a “break even” point had been reached. He stated that the recovery had been good, but that budgeting challenges remain. Among the notable items in planning for the budget are the following:

1. Health Insurance Premiums (a \$100 increase for priests, others premiums’ remaining consistent with 2009 rates), Business Insurance Premiums: Property insurance: no change unless the parish had recently added property, the possibility of a 5% discount if the parish participates in the disaster preparedness process), Liability insurance (no change), Worker’s compensation (no change) and Auto (no change).
2. Pension Contributions: the plan is currently underfunded and thus being reviewed with the possibility of increased contribution rates.
3. Electricity: As of June 1, Reliant Energy will have an 18% decrease from the current rate. Those in Montgomery, Brazoria and other counties not served by Reliant may experience different rates.
4. DS&L Deposited Interest Income: The current rate of 2.8% will be used for budgeting purposes.
- 5 Salaries: The Chancery is planning on a 1% across the board cost of living adjustment.
6. The server provider network was changed to AETNA on January and that contract runs until December 31, 2010. An update will be given later in the year.

The disaster recovery plan was explained further. If a parish follows the guidelines of the plan and implements it correctly, there will be a five percent discount in property insurance for the parish. There is a “menu of tasks” to be accomplished. A pastor must name a designated person as the disaster recovery coordinator and then name a committee. Committees should be comprised of 2-4 people, possible members coming from a parish’s finance council, pastoral council, school council as well as person responsible for the facilities. The coordinator should be on-site at the parish as soon as possible after a disaster.

Training will be available from the Archdiocese in April and May with the assistance of Meredith Smith and Deacon Duck. The archdiocese will help all coordinators complete their plans and train personnel in the software to be used. The archdiocese is seeking 100% compliance among the parishes. The plan needs to be complete by August 31, 2010 in order for a parish to receive the discount. The archdiocese will help in any way it can with each parish to make sure that such compliance occurs.

At the request of Cardinal DiNardo, Mr. Hessel gave a couple of examples of what parishes would be required to do under this plan. The examples given were: 1) Equipment should be moved from the first floor to the second floor, away from windows so as not to be damaged by flooding; 2) There will be a contractual relationship with a company elsewhere in the country that will staff a toll-free number for parishes and priests to call into before, during, and after a disaster.

Msgr. Sheltz pointed out that a hurricane is only one possible disaster, and that this plan would also foresee such disasters as a gas explosion, a terrorist act, etc.

Mr. Hessel also pointed out that the discount on insurance would be continued the following year. He reminded the council that the Pastoral Manual already calls for a parish to have a Building and Grounds Committee and that a parish should have reserved funds in designated specifically for disasters.

Fr. Gietl asked a question about human resources for priests: priests have been required to have an annual physical. Fr. Gietl inquired as to whether or not that requirement had changed. Both Cardinal DiNardo and Mr. Hessel responded negatively, that the requirement was still in place. Fr. Horrigan said the annual physical is part of the priest's annual benefit package and is covered at 100% with no out-of-pocket expense to the priest.

Chancery salaries will increase across the board with a 1% cost of living adjustment. Mr. Hessel pointed out that the archdiocese continues to experience budget pressures. This has resulted in some open positions being eliminated, yet merit pay will be continued. Msgr. Sheltz pointed out that there is a difference between merit pay and merit bonuses.

The Council thanked Mr. Hessel for his work on the financial issues facing the Archdiocese and invited him back to the June 1 meeting for final approval of the 2010-11 fiscal year budget.

NFPC CONFERENCE REPORT: Fr. Horrigan gave a report of the recently concluded conference of the National Federation of Priests' Councils hosted by the Archdiocese in Houston. The conference was well received by the approximately 100 priests in attendance. They enjoyed the Texas hospitality and Mass with Cardinal DiNardo at the Co-Cathedral of the Sacred Heart and dinner at the Cathedral Centre. The Archdiocese received more than \$33,000 in donations from various dioceses and supporters and was able to hold its overall expenses to less than \$10,000 with the surplus being returned to NFPC. He offered thanks to local committee of Fr. Richard Wahl, C.S.B. and Fr. Skip Negley, as well as Roz Hill and Stephany Califa in the Archdiocesan Development Department for all their work on planning for the conference. Several priests of the archdiocese attended the conference throughout the week and reported favorably on the fraternity of priests throughout the country who attended.

FUTURE COUNCIL AGENDA TOPICS: Fr. Horrigan led a discussion on brainstorming future topics for the Council to address in the coming year. Among the many topics generated were: parish boundaries, immigration response, home visitation and blessings, the new translation of the Roman Missal, evangelization of inactive Catholics, sacramental awareness and formation for First Communion and First Reconciliation, convalidations of civil marriages, the social life of the presbyterate, the structure of the deanery system and role of deans, and Archdiocesan communications, particularly the website and use of social media.

All priests of the Archdiocese, both diocesan and religious, are welcome to bring forward topics for consideration by the Council. It was suggested that Council members make a concentrated effort to visit all deaneries and constituencies they represent on at least a yearly basis.

ANNUAL SPIRITUAL RETREAT ALLOWANCE: Msgr. Sheltz stated that two retreat centers, Holy Name on Bunker Hill and the Christian Renewal Center in Dickinson, have been subsidizing retreats for priests since they have both raised their rates. It was thus recommended that the annual allowance for priests' retreats be incrementally raised \$25 a year for 3 years, so that it will go from \$300 to \$325 this year, to \$350 next year, to \$375 the following year. (This is part of the compensation offered to priests by their parishes.) Cardinal DiNardo noted that he realizes it is the responsibility of the ordinary to make sure that all priests are indeed making their annual retreats and that priests need to be held accountable for this.

CARDINAL'S CONSULTATION AND ANNOUNCEMENTS: Cardinal DiNardo stated that he had seen Bishop Joe Vasquez who is doing well in his new post as the bishop of Austin.

Cardinal DiNardo said that both Msgrs. Sheltz and Rossi, as Vicars General, will be the ministers of the sacrament of Confirmation for the Archdiocese, taking on the confirmations that were to take place under Bishop Vasquez. He further stated that while he has requested that two auxiliary bishops be named to the Archdiocese, that these appointments may take some time. The seat for the archbishop of San Antonio is currently vacant after Archbishop Gomez's appointment as the Archbishop of Los Angeles.

On Easter Sunday, 2,254 people were welcomed into the Catholic Church in the Archdiocese. On the Feast of the Pentecost, there were over 1,000 confirmations.

In response to a question posed about the Archdiocesan Pastoral Council, the archbishop stated that their work is continuing, but that funding options for the Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan are currently being studied.

Fr. Canizares asked the Cardinal his impressions of the recent criticism of the Holy Father surrounding the issue of clergy sexual abuse and the Church's response to it. Cardinal DiNardo pointed out that the then-Cardinal Ratzinger was very helpful when the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops was dealing with this topic, and that he was most clear, coherent and very helpful during the process. Both Cardinal DiNardo and the Council reaffirmed their strong support of and prayers for the Holy Father as he guides the Church through this period of healing and renewal.

AGENDA ITEMS: Among the agenda items for the future include the annual archdiocesan budget and the archdiocesan plans for the implementation of the new translation of the Roman Missal.

CLOSING PRAYER: Cardinal DiNardo offered the closing prayer at 12 p.m.

NEXT MEETING: Tuesday, June 1, 2010 from 10 am – 2 pm at St. Mary's Seminary, Nold Education Building conference room.
