## ALL SOULS DAY AND MASS STIPENDS

A practice seems to have developed in some parishes that for All Souls Day parishioners are encouraged to write down the names of deceased loved ones and with a donation, place the envelope in the collection. The All Souls Day Masses are celebrated for all the named persons and the priests distribute the entire collected amount amongst themselves. This practice is scandalous and violates the law of the Church regarding Mass stipends. In 1992 the Congregation for the Clergy issued a directive on Collective Mass Intentions. In this document it is stated that the Church allows on rare occasions the combining of Mass intentions as long as the faithful are explicitly informed that the Mass intentions will be combined. In these cases, however, the priest may only take the dollar amount equal to one stipend (\$5.00 in the dioceses of Texas). The rest of the stipend offering is to be forwarded to other priests to fulfill the Mass intentions or to the chancery for forwarding to missionary priests. The text of the Congregation's directive can be found in the Eucharist section of the diocesan Pastoral Manual.

## REMINDER – ELECTION SEASON

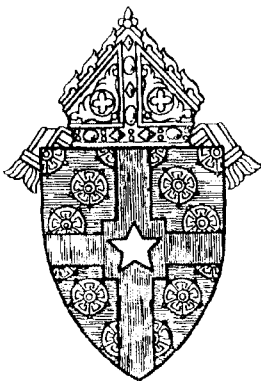
In the document *Faithful Citizenship*, the US Bishops Conference has outlined the important principles to be considered in voting. They include Protecting Human Life, Promoting Family Life, Pursuing Social Justice and Practicing Global Solidarity. Teaching, from the pulpit or otherwise, which omits comprehensive reference to all these principles does a disservice to the Bishops' efforts to fully inform the consciences of the Faithful and may be viewed as selective and partisan. Homilists are encouraged to be mindful that the goal of the Church to encourage Catholics to vote, while not endorsing specific candidates or political parties, cannot be achieved by fragmenting the message of *Faithful Citizenship*.

Also, please remember that distribution of political literature (propaganda, endorsements of political party or candidate, etc.) on parish property is prohibited. These publications are not proper for distribution on parish property as they engage in partisan politics. Please do not allow political literature to be distributed by parishioners or anyone else in the Church or on parish property unless it is voter education material prepared by the USCCB or has the specific approval of the Archbishop's office.

Minutes  
Meeting of August 16, 2011

The Council met in the Board Room of the Nold Education Building at St. Mary's Seminary. Cardinal Daniel DiNardo presided. Fr. Sean Horrigan called the meeting to order at 10 a.m. Father Joe Gietl offered the Opening Prayer. Fr. Paul Felix took the roll.

MINUTES: The minutes of June 7, 2011 were accepted as presented. Msgr. Rossi moved the acceptance of the minutes and Fr. Gietl seconded it. They were accepted by a voice vote.

NEW COMMUNICATIONS POLICY: Ms. Jenny Faber, the Archdiocesan Director of Communications, presented the Archdiocesan News Media Policy. The policy deals with several topics on how the archdiocese and parishes can best communicate with the news media. The archdiocese seeks to be proactive in getting Catholic news to the secular media, but it is important to establish clear lines of communication and contact persons. All pastors are urged to speak with the Communication office if they are ever contacted for comment on breaking news so that a response can be properly formulated and presented. The office is ready to assist parishes promote news of wide interest. The policy will be widely distributed when finalized.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE SYSTEM: Deacon Charlie Duck presented a review of the emergency response system test that was conducted earlier this summer. The system is designed to help get notice to all priests in case of an emergency such as we experienced with Hurricane Ike. A test was run on Friday, July 29 at 11:30 a.m. via phone call or text message sent to more than 200 priests who were asked to respond to a centralized number. Deacon Duck explained that the long wait for many of those who called in was due to the fact that the Crawford Company, which processes the calls, only had a skeleton crew on duty at the time. Of the 250 priests who were contacted 82 responded while more

than 160 did not respond. While there was some misinformation in the records, it was judged that the response rate was less than desirable.

Deacon Duck said another test likely will be conducted in the coming months once modifications are made. It is necessary that adequate staffing be present with Crawford Company to handle the incoming call load. Likewise the message itself needs to be clarified so that priests know to respond in a timely fashion. The questionnaire that is asked of the caller also needs to be modified to record present contact information. Much discussion ensued and while the importance of the Emergency Response System was acknowledged, the execution of such test messages and the response of the clergy needs to be vastly improved if the system is to prove to be beneficial and cost effective. The safety of priests and property in case of emergency must be a top priority, Cardinal DiNardo said.

ROMAN MISSAL UPDATE: Mr. David Wood, Director of the Archdiocesan Office of Worship, updated the Council on the progress toward the implementation of the new English translation of the Roman Missal. Mr. Wood announced plans for a special presentation by Msgr. James Moroney for priests in conjunction with the annual Steele lecture. Msgr. Moroney is the executive Secretary of *Vox Clara*, an international committee of bishops that advises the Vatican regarding English liturgical translations. The presentations for priests will be Friday, Sept. 23 at 10:30 a.m. at the seminary. The priests' presentation will take up two topics: 1) the *Ars Celebrandi* and the New Roman Missal and 2) Rhetorical Forms of the New Roman Missal. The Steele Lecture is that same night at 7:30 p.m.

Cardinal DiNardo also invites all priests to a gathering of priests to look at the texts for the Advent season on Oct. 6 at 1:30-3 p.m. at the Co-Cathedral. The Cardinal encouraged priests to use the many Internet resources available on the Roman Missal to update themselves and the lay faithful in the coming weeks. Among the notable sites are the USCCB Roman Missal page and the Archdiocesan website, as well as ICEL's main page. The Office of Worship is making available pew cards for all parishes, and has special pricing on ordering the new missals from various publishers. It was also noted of the need for ongoing accent reduction support for priests for whom English is their second language.

RETIREMENT COMPENSATION: Ms. Michele Yanta, Director of the Archdiocesan Human Resources Department, visited the Council to discuss retirement compensation for priests. She provided a handout that was designed to provide an overview of the Archdiocesan Pension Plan specifically for clergy in a Q&A format. Ms. Yanta emphasized three important components for a reliable retirement plan for priests: pension, Social Security and a savings program (such as 401(k), 403B, IRA, etc.). Msgr. Rossi suggested a triennial review of benefits per month for retired priests. The discussion included concerns that special attention should be given to newly ordained and international priests helping them to understand the importance of advance financial planning.

CATHOLIC CEMETERIES: Mr. Gus Hollis, Director of Catholic Cemeteries, presented the Council a new program for promoting Catholic cemeteries in partnership with the Knights of Columbus. This program would start initially for one year with the potential of being extended indefinitely. The program provides for the payment of a commission to any Council that refers a Knight, their family or friends to Mount Olivet Catholic Cemetery and Mausoleum, in Dickinson or Calvary Catholic Cemetery in Galveston. There will be a Family Service pre-need commission of 10 percent and a Knights of Columbus commission of 10 percent. The Knights of Columbus will provide referrals only. The Catholic Cemeteries' staff is the only one who may sell rights of interment. The distributions to the Knights of Columbus councils will be used for charitable purposes. Priests are encouraged to consider having their respective KC councils participate in the program.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/CONSULTATIONS: Cardinal DiNardo announced that Auxiliary Bishop Emeritus Rizzotto turns 80 on September 8. Priests are encouraged to send personal greetings. A more formal recognition will be held at the upcoming Priests' Christmas party on Dec. 15.

The Cardinal expressed concern on the new directives coming from the federal government's Department of Health and Human Services that are putting us in a bind regarding conscience clauses. October is Pro-Life Month and priests are encouraged to speak and write about the need to safeguard the dignity of all human life throughout the month.
