SUMMER REPLACEMENT PRIEST - PLAN EARLY

If you plan a vacation from June to late August, please begin now to look for priests to cover your Masses.

Though priests are responsible for finding their own replacements, if the visiting priest is without faculties in this Archdiocese, he must be approved for ministry from the Chancellor. The visiting priest must provide a recent letter from his bishop or religious superior stating that he is a priest in good standing and has permission to be in the Archdiocese.

In addition, please be advised that if you wish to invite a foreign national priest who is not a permanent resident of the United States, you must consult with the Chancellor's Office to ensure that the foreign national priest has authorization to work in the U.S. This consultation should occur in advance of extending the invitation.

GODPARENTS AND TESTIMONIAL LETTERS

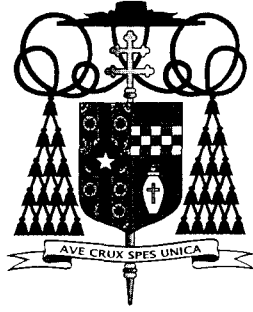
To be a sponsor for either Baptism or Confirmation, it is required that the person be a baptized, confirmed and practicing Catholic (c. 872-874). If the sponsor is married, the marriage must be a valid and recognized marriage in the Church. No letter of suitability from the sponsor's parish is required by canon law or diocesan guidelines. If there is concern, the parish *may ask the sponsor* to sign a letter stating that they meet the requirements and conditions to be a sponsor, but this is not a requirement.

Please inform DRE's, baptismal teams and others that there is no requirement for such letters of testimony from the priest or parish of the Baptism or Confirmation sponsor.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

Parishes are encouraged to have a separate program for adult Catholics seeking to be confirmed. The Adult confirmations will be on the weekend of Pentecost Sunday, May 26-27, 2012, and the weekend of Trinity, June 2-3, 2012. Priests do not have the faculty to confirm an adult unless they are being received into the church (by baptism or profession of faith) at the same ceremony.

To: All Pastors

My brother priests:

I ask you to please remind your parishioners of the collection on the Solemnity of Corpus Christi (weekend of June 9-10, 2012) for the support of men studying for the priesthood for our Archdiocese and the religious communities which staff some of our parishes. Your personal appeal for a very generous contribution from each parishioner will help to realize an increase over the \$1,786,887.56 reported last year.

Half of the collection from parishes staffed by religious priests will be returned to their communities. In 2012, \$163,775.27 of the 2011 collection was forwarded to the religious orders for the support of their seminarians.

Archdiocesan seminarians study not only at St. Mary Seminary in Houston, but also in Dallas, San Antonio, St. Benedict, Louisiana, and Rome. The total budget for the fiscal year 2012-13 is \$4,439,442. This includes the costs associated with the operating of St. Mary Seminary as well as the expenses of the education of seminarians, the continuing education of priests and the training of permanent deacons and laity. Of this amount, the archdiocesan subsidy is \$2,652,554.44.

The Trust Fund is able to cover about half the expense, but the collection is truly required to make up the balance of funds needed. A generous response from each parish is deeply appreciated and needed. Please remember that the total offertory collection for the weekend of June 9-10 is to be forwarded to the Chancery by June 30th.

I ask you to print the announcement below in your parish bulletin for the weekend prior to the collection.

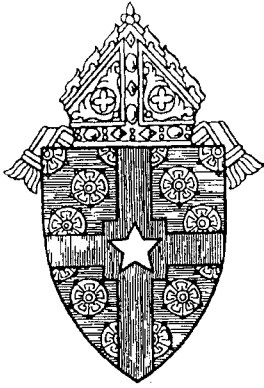

Minutes
Meeting of February 21, 2012

The Council met in the third floor conference room of the Downtown Chancery. Daniel Cardinal DiNardo called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m. and introduced Bishop-elect George Sheltz. Msgr. Frank Rossi offered the Opening Prayer. Fr. Paul Felix took the roll.

MINUTES: The minutes of December 6, 2011 were accepted as presented. Fr. Lahart moved the acceptance of the minutes and Fr. Patout seconded it. They were accepted by a voice vote.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS (CHAIRMAN & SECRETARY): Bishop-elect Msgr. George Sheltz conducted the election of officers. Fr. Dan Lahart and Fr. Rivers Patout were nominated for Chairman. The vote was taken. Fr. Patout was elected Chairman. Fr. Felix was reelected to secretary with no others having accepted nomination.

WELCOME OF THE NEW MEMBERS: Bishop-elect Msgr. George Sheltz welcomed the new members, Fr. Page Polk, O.F.M., Fr. Clint Ressler, and Fr. Miguel Solorzano to the Council.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT PROGRAM: Ms. Julie Blevins appeared before the Council to present, for clarification, the question of whether we continue with the current policy regarding who is required to take VIRTUS. Since the publication of the letter that was sent in the clergy newsletter of September 2011, there has been some concern expressed over the distinction between those who are required to take VIRTUS and those who are recommended to take VIRTUS. The discretionary judgment being left to the pastor.

Those who fall into the latter category are the following:

- Liturgical Ministers (lectors, ushers, EMHC's, acolytes/servers, choirs, wedding coordinators).
- Food Pantry Volunteers (other than SVDP) where families with children are served.
- Volunteers in any other public ministry, which carries with it an "implied trust".

A discussion followed and it was the recommendation of the Presbyteral Council that the current policy of the pastor having discretion over those categories which are 'recommended' remains in effect.

REPORT ON CONVOCATION OF CLERGY: Fr. Sean Horrigan reported on the preparations for the Ministry to Priest Days Convocation 2012.

The theme of the convocation is "The Sign of the Times – Facing the Challenges of the Day".

The daily themes are as follows:

Monday: "Sign of the Times – Tracing Our Roots."

Tuesday: "Sign of the Times – Living and Evangelizing in the World."

Session 1 will be Evangelization in Modern Time: Spiritual vs Religious by Fr. Dave Dwyer of Catholic Radio and Busted Halo. Later in the day there will be an optional presentation on Catholic relief services with Fr. David Florez.

Session 2 will discuss the Impact of Social Media: Pastoral Responses to the Challenges of Today's Society by Msgr. Ed Arsenault of the St. Luke Institute

Wednesday: "Sign of the Times – Reality of Pastoral Ministry."

Session 3 is The Church 2012: Priestly Ministry Today by Msgr. Ed Arsenault.

Later in the day there will be an optional presentation on Exposition and Adoration by Msgr. Chester Borski.

Session 4 is A Vision of the Future: The Archdiocesan Pastoral Plan and the Presbyterate of Galveston – Houston.

Thursday: "Sign of the Times – United to Christ to Proclaim the Good News."

The major session will be Cardinal's State of the Archdiocese Address and Open Questions.

Father Horrigan indicated that the priests would be asked to participate in a survey on how can the pastoral plan best serve the priests? and how can priests best serve the pastoral plan? Father Horrigan asked, "what do priests want to see come out of the pastoral planning process?"

Cardinal DiNardo commented that at the meeting of cardinals with the Holy Father. It was clear that Pope Benedict's major preoccupation is the Year of Faith dedicated to the New Evangelization and the person of Jesus. This should dovetail with the presentations at the convocation.

Father Horrigan indicated that the rates have increased for the first time in 12 years. The hotel rate has gone up by \$10 and registration for the conference has increased \$75 from \$350-\$425. This should be provided for in the budget for priest's continuing education.

A question was raised regarding the ability of priests serving in chaplaincies to participate. The response was that they should go through Fr. Brendan Cahill about funding. Retired priests are able to go for free or for a portion of the costs covered by the Archdiocese.

BUDGET PROCESS: Mr. David Hessel, Archdiocesan Finance Officer and Business Manager accompanied by Ms. Michele Yanta, Archdiocesan Director of Human Resources and Ms. Christina Deajon, Vice Chancellor, and Associate General Counsel, reported that an approximate increase of 4% in insurance premiums, paid by the parish or school, will be needed to cover the cost of providing those benefits to clergy and lay employees. They were seeking input as to the timing of the increase.

A letter from Sr. Kevina Keating, Superintendent of Catholic Schools, was included in the documentation in which the request was made to find another way to finance or to delay the increase until the Catholic Schools Office's plan had been completed for bringing school employees' salaries up to the stated goal of 80% of public school rates.

One member stated that this proposed increase in insurance premiums presented a difficulty in view of the fact that tuition rates for the coming school year have already been published.

ANNOUNCEMENTS/CONSULTATIONS Cardinal DiNardo presented two items for feedback from the Council:

The first concern was about the establishment of the proposed personal parish (a parish that serves particular groups such as, for example, Our Lady of Walsingham serves the former Anglicans with the liturgical Anglican usage, or an ethnic parish that serves in the common language of the dominant ethnicity) for the extraordinary form of the Mass and Sacraments as provided for by Pope Benedict XVI in the motu proprio *Summorum Pontificum*. A letter was distributed from Fr. Charles Van Vliet of the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter, whose community would staff the parish. The proposed name of the parish is Regina Caeli.


The second matter presented was concerning the question of how to transfer the church of Our Lady of Walsingham to the Anglican Ordinariate as the new headquarters for the United States. There is confusion as to whether the usual consultation and canonical

process for alienation of church property has to be conducted or whether the same is accomplished through the Roman decree.

CLOSING PRAYER: Cardinal DiNardo led the Council in the concluding prayer.

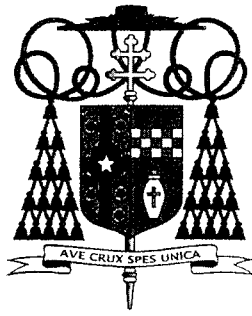

Dear Brother Priests,

As you know, this Archdiocesan event is sponsored by the Office of Youth Ministry, and the theme chosen for this year will be “Created Anew.”

The young people of the Archdiocese look to you, as their spiritual leader, for support and guidance as they strive to be faithful witnesses of our Catholic faith amidst their personal challenges and societal pressures. 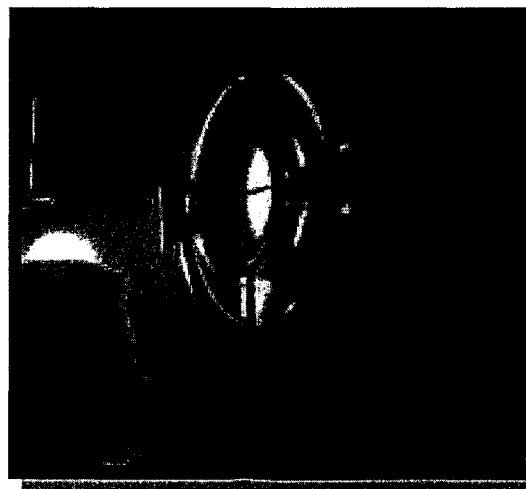
