HOLY DAYS OF OBLIGATION

On back to back occurrence of Sunday and Holy Days, there is a precept of Eucharist participation for each day. However, whenever January 1, the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God, or August 15, the Solemnity of the Assumption, or November 1, the Solemnity of All Saints, falls on a Saturday or on a Monday, the precept to attend Mass is abrogated (NCCB, 11/17/92, Congregation for Bishops, 7/4/92). While the Holy day obligation is automatically abrogated on these days, the liturgy of the feast is still to be celebrated in every parish and institution at a convenient time in such a way that the dignity of the feast is maintained.

SAVE THE DATE - RED MASS FOR THE LEGAL PROFESSION

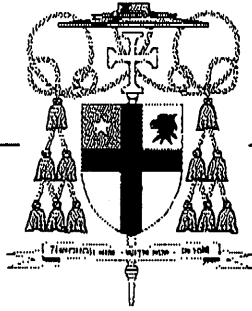

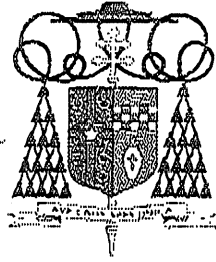

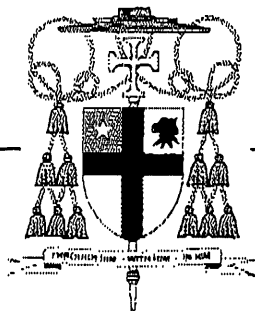

Dear Brother Priests and Deacons:

The Offices of Youth Ministry and Continuing Christian Education are changing the names of their offices, effective Aug. 1, 2012. The Office of Continuing Christian Education will be known as the **Office of Evangelization and Catechesis**. The Office of Youth Ministry will change its title to the **Office of Adolescent Catechesis and Evangelization**. These new office titles expand our understanding of how we approach catechetical and lifelong faith formation in our Archdiocese.

The **Office of Evangelization and Catechesis'** new title reflects the office's parallel to its counterpart at the USCCB and better emphasizes the role of the evangelizing efforts that are integral to our catechetical mission. Conversion and the ability to articulate our beliefs require knowledge of the faith and experiences of Jesus Christ within the Christian community through worship, the study of scripture, prayer and moral formation. The OEC office will continue to be a resource to parishes and Catholic schools in their efforts to foster lifelong catechesis and to form catechetical leaders who carry out this mission in parish or school communities.

The **Office of Adolescent Catechesis and Evangelization** will provide direction, leadership and formation of parish catechetical leaders who minister to younger and older adolescents. The office's approach to adolescent catechesis and faith formation will encourage parishes, schools and movements to be responsive to the spiritual, emotional, psychological, social and physical development of youth. Evangelization and catechesis are particularly important areas of focus for the OACE, which will work to help the Church be perceived by youth as their spiritual home, a place of welcome and a community of faith. Likewise, the office's catechetical efforts will seek to assist those who are leading young people in the ways of Christian discipleship. OACE will support ministry to, with, by and for youth that draws young people to a responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the Church.

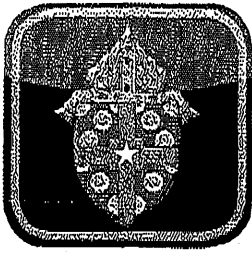
During this year, both offices will work collaboratively, along with the Catholic Schools Office, in implementing and reorganizing staff responsibilities that will unite our catechetical and evangelizing efforts.

FAQs: The Office of Evangelization and Catechesis and The Office of Adolescent Catechesis and Evangelization

I've heard the names of the Office of Youth Ministry and Office of Continuing Christian Education are changing. What are the offices' new names?

The Office of Continuing Christian Education will be identified as the **Office of Evangelization and Catechesis** and the Office of Youth Ministry will be known as the **Office of Adolescent Catechesis and Evangelization**.

Why the change? What's the significance of these new descriptions for the offices?

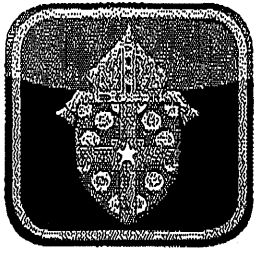
These new office titles expand our understanding of how we approach catechetical and lifelong faith formation in our Archdiocese. Evangelization is a call to continuing conversion and is the work of the entire Church. The U.S. bishops have stated three goals of evangelization: to live our faith fully; to share our faith with others; and to transform the world in Christ. The Office of Evangelization and Catechesis' mission will be to bring about in all Catholics an enthusiasm for their faith so that, in learning and living their faith, they can freely share it with others. The OEC's mission also includes welcoming all people to hear the message of salvation in Jesus Christ, so they may come to join us in the fullness of the Catholic faith.

Through a renewed vision, the Office of Adolescent Catechesis and Evangelization will guide a comprehensive Catholic youth ministry rooted in Gospel values, which reflects a family and multicultural perspective. The office will provide direction, leadership and formation of parish catechetical leaders who minister to younger and older adolescents. The office's approach to adolescent catechesis and faith formation will encourage parishes, schools and movements to be responsive to the spiritual, emotional, psychological, social and physical development of youth. Evangelization and catechesis are particularly important areas of focus for the OACE, which will work to help the Church be perceived by youth as their spiritual home, a place of welcome and a community of faith. Likewise, the office's catechetical efforts will seek to assist those who are leading young people in the ways of Christian discipleship. OACE will support ministry to, with, by and for youth that draws young people to a responsible participation in the life, mission and work of the Church.

How are the two departments transforming to reflect the new names of the offices?

The Office of Evangelization and Catechesis will place emphasis on Early Childhood, Elementary, Sacramental and Adult Formation. Younger and Older Adolescent Catechesis (including Confirmation formation for youth, Quinceañera preparation and Human Sexuality formation) will reside in the Office of Adolescent Catechesis and Evangelization. Both offices will collaborate hand in hand – along with the other pastoral ministry offices – in the formation of pastoral leaders. The offices will act as consultants, when needed, to the Catholic Schools Office, which shares in this catechetical mission of our Archdiocese. You may notice future events and ministry formation opportunities being co-sponsored by the OEC and OACE offices.

When will the changes take effect?

Changes take effect on August 1, but the OEC and OACE offices will be working this entire year on realizing the vision of this change and helping parishes with their needs during the implementation of this vision.

One current staff person who split time between the Office of Youth Ministry and the Office of Continuing Christian Education will now be dedicated to Adolescent Catechesis as a member of the OACE. Another staff person who split time between the Office of Continuing Christian Education and the Catholic Schools Office will work full time in the OEC, focusing on adult formation. Both offices will work collaboratively, along with the Catholic Schools Office, in implementing and reorganizing staff responsibilities that will unite our catechetical and evangelizing efforts.

What differences will parishes and schools experience with these changes?

The OEC and OACE will work with parishes, schools and parish catechetical leaders as they encounter this paradigm shift, along with its challenges and implications. Several articles will be published in Archdiocesan and departmental communications to help everyone reach a better understanding of our Archdiocese's catechetical mission.

The Archdiocese believes that parishes and schools will be served better through this collaborative model of lifelong faith formation.
