SUMMER REPLACEMENT PRIEST - PLAN EARLY

If you plan a vacation from June to late August, please begin now to look for priests to cover your Masses.

Though priests are responsible for finding their own replacements, if the visiting priest is without faculties in this Archdiocese, he must be approved for ministry by the Chancellor. The visiting priest must provide a recent letter from his bishop or religious superior stating that he is a priest in good standing and has permission to be in the Archdiocese.

If the priest is a foreign national, he must have the proper authorization to work in the United States.

ADULT CONFIRMATION

Parishes are encouraged to have a separate program for adult Catholics seeking to be confirmed. The Adult confirmations will be on the weekend of Pentecost Sunday, May 18-19, 2013. Priests do not have the faculty to confirm an adult unless they are being received into the church (by baptism or profession of faith) at the same ceremony.

My brother priest:

The 2012 Catholic Home Missions Appeal is scheduled for the weekend of April 27-28. Four out of every ten dioceses in the United States cannot offer their people basic pastoral care or provide priestly formation and lay ministry training without outside help. The Catholic Home Missions Appeal supports important pastoral projects like faith formation, evangelization programs, and aid to poor parishes.

The Diocese of Amarillo covers a 26,000 square mile area in the remote and desolate northern portion of the Texas Panhandle. Many parishioners must travel 30 miles or more each way to attend Mass and receive the sacraments. Additionally, more than half of all parishes in the diocese are without a full-time priest, and many of the available priests serve two to three parishes. With help from the Appeal, the diocese's seminarian education and formation program is able to identify, cultivate, and prepare young men to respond to the call to the priesthood. The Appeal provides much needed relief as the diocese continues to struggle to meet the pastoral and sacramental needs of parishioners.

The millions of Catholics who live in home mission dioceses rely on your generous support. Please encourage your parishioners to give generously to the Catholic Home Missions Appeal and help strengthen the Church at home.



The Catholic Communication Campaign (CCC) supports projects throughout the world that encourage use of new media as a tool for the New Evangelization. Dear Pastor:

As you know, one of the responsibilities of the Archdiocesan Archives is to microfilm the parish sacramental records. These records are among the most important that parishes keep, and microfilming the records ensures their security. It provides a back-up copy of the records, should anything happen to the original registers. In addition, the Archives uses the microfilmed registers to assist individuals in locating their sacramental records.

The last microfilming project was done in 2007, and it is again time to update our records. Microfilming is set to begin in May, and it will continue through the summer, in order to cover the entire Archdiocese. The Archives staff will contact your secretary or records staff to schedule your parish records.

We have again contracted with an outside vendor to handle the microfilming. As we have done in the past, we will ask each parish to bring their records to the downtown Chancery, where they will be prepped for filming and transferred to the vendor. For this project, the vendor will retain the books over a one-week period. During this time, requests for sacramental records can be referred to the Archives.

Your cooperation with this important project is appreciated. Please share this information with your parish staff. If you have any questions about the project, please contact Lisa May in the Archives.
