

Rev. George T. Montague, S.M., S.Th.D. (Monday, October 18 and Wednesday, October 20)

Author of over twenty books on both the scholarly and popular level, Reverend George Montague has specialized in the Pneumatology of both Old and New Testaments, having written or contributed to a number of studies in that discipline. He has also researched and written in the field of Biblical interpretation (hermeneutics), and in the Marian theology in the gospel of John. Rev. Montague completed his doctorate on the writings of St. Paul and is especially interested in Paul's theology of spiritual growth.


Rev. Montague participated in a summer study in Israel with Hebrew Union College and in the excavation of Tel Gezer in 1966 under Dr. William Dever. Currently he is a New Testament professor at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, Texas.

**Rev. Juan Alfaro, S.S.L.** (Tuesday, October 19 and Thursday, October 21)

Reverend Juan Alfaro was born in Miranda, Navarra Spain. After graduating from Xavier High School, he joined the Benedictine Order and went to Manila, Philippines to be a missionary. He studied theology at the University of Santo Tomas, and was ordained a priest on Dec 23, 1962. After receiving a doctorate in theology in 1964, he entered the Pontifical Biblical Institute in Rome and was awarded a Doctorandus in Re Biblica. His fourth year in Rome was spent teaching "Johannine Writings" at the International Benedictine College of Sant Anselmo. Returning to Manila in 1968, he taught Scripture at the Benedictine Abbey, San Beda College, the University of Santo Tomas, and the Jesuit School of Theology.

Rev. Alfaro came to San Antonio in 1972 to work at the Mexican American Cultural Center, now the Mexican American Catholic College. He served from 1984-1989 at St. Matthew's parish as a Parochial Vicar, and in 1991, came to Saint Rose of Lima parish where he has been until now. He continues to teach at local colleges and universities and conduct biblical workshops in about 45 dioceses. He has written numerous books, mostly on Scripture, and he has published many articles in biblical and theological magazines and Catholic newspapers.

Our Journey Begins: From the Earliest Traditions to the Exile

Although the Church Fathers, reading the Old Testament in the light of the New, saw the spiritual, Christological meaning everywhere, we will follow a more literal reading of the Hebrew bible to discover how God unveiled the mystery of the Spirit little by little. We will begin with the earliest traditions, the Yahwist account of the spirit as lifebreath given to Adam, and then follow the trail through the Elohist, Deuteronomy, the books of Samuel and Kings and the pre-exilic prophets, noting both the positive picture of the Spirit as well as Jeremiah's ambivalence due to the false prophets' claims to be speaking by the Spirit of God.

From the Exile to Jesus: The Spirit Wakes the Dry Bones, Rebuilds Israel, Inspires Wisdom and Song

To a people disheartened by exile Ezekiel prophesies resurrection. Second and Third Isaiah promise a new outpouring of the Spirit at the homecoming, and Joel proclaims the gift of the Spirit upon "all flesh." The psalms equate the "holy spirit" with God's presence, and the Wisdom literature lays the groundwork for the Trinitarian revelation in the New Testament.

The composition and order of the Gospel of John:

We will review the twofold edition of the Gospel and the problems and challenges of the Johannine community at the end of the first century as reflected in the first letter of John. Next we will study the final edition of the Gospel and the arrangement of the Gospel contents centered in Jesus, the light of the world.

The Spiritual Gospel:

We will examine Jesus' baptism with the Spirit on the Jordan river, and the baptism of the disciples on Easter Sunday. We will also look at the resurrection of Jesus and the transformation of the disciples and the self-understanding of the new identity of Christians.

The Last Supper discourse:

We will study the unity of the discourse in its present form and the role of the Spirit in the Christian community and in its confrontation with the world. We will also examine the Spirit, the Spirit of truth, the Paraclete and the new understanding of the presence and message of Jesus living in the disciples.

The Spirit and the glorified Jesus:

We will learn about the events on Mount Calvary as the arrival of God's Kingdom, the gift of the Spirit and the living water, the birth of the Church as the eschatological family of Jesus, the paschal mystery in John's Gospel, and the birth of water and of the Spirit

Paul: Dynamic Theologian of the Holy Spirit

St. Paul understands the human person as spirit, soul, body. The Holy Spirit is being given constantly to the believer; he is the interior revealer of the mystery of Christ and of the Father; the Spirit is intimately joined to the body of Jesus and the body of the Christian, and he manifests his power through charismatic gifts of the Spirit. The Spirit enables us to transcend the Law and to journey toward glory with invincible hope.

10:45 a.m. Presentation: Rev. George Montague, S.M., S.T.D. The Spirit in Mark and Matthew

In Mark the Holy Spirit is primarily the Spirit of power by which Jesus conquers Satan in all his manifestations. The Holy Spirit, agent of the conception of Jesus, announces a new creation in Jesus' baptism; and Matthew shows how Jesus' understanding of the eschatological Spirit differs from that of John the Baptist. The risen Lord abides in the church through his spiritual presence in a way different from Luke, who stresses the role of the Holy Spirit.

1:30 p.m. Presentation: Rev. George Montague, S.M., S.T.D. Luke, the Narrative Theologian of the Holy Spirit

In the infancy account Luke presents a prologue to both his gospel and the Acts, showing a domestic Pentecost that anticipates the descent of the Spirit in Acts 2 and the work of the Spirit in the development of the Church. In the gospel Jesus proclaims his anointing by the Spirit as he begins his mission of preaching, healing, and exorcizing. The Holy Spirit leads Jesus' personal prayer and teaches inwardly what Jesus teaches outwardly in the Lord's prayer.

3:15 p.m. Presentation: Rev. George Montague, S.M., S.T.D. The Summit: John's Theology of the Holy Spirit

Beyond adoption, new birth given by the Holy Spirit, who is the living water gushing from Jesus' side, the gift also of Jesus' last breath. The Paraclete, the only personal image of the Holy Spirit, unfolds the mystery of Jesus and the Father and vindicates the church against the attacks of the world.
